CORONATION VISIT TO SCOTLAND

ROYAL PROCESSION TO THE NATIONAL SERVICE

DETAILS OF WEEK'S PROGRAMME

The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh will drive in State, preceded by the Honours of Scotland, to the National Service in St. Giles Cathedral on Wednesday, June 24.

Her Majesty will drive in an open carriage which will be flanked by one Officer and ten Archers of the Royal Company of Archers.

Preceding the Royal Carriage will be the carriage with the Honours of Scotland, borne by the Duke of Hamilton, the Earl of Crawford and Balcarres and the Earl of Home.

This carriage in turn will be preceded by a carriage containing the Lord Lyon King of Arms, Sir Thomas Innes of Learney, K.C.V.O., and two Heralds.

This section of the Procession will be headed by the Hereditary Banner Bearer of Scotland, the Viscount Dudhope, who will be mounted.

The first part of the Procession will include detachments of the Scots Guards, the Royal Air Force, the Army and the Royal Navy.

There will be massed pipe bands and massed military bands and the mounted band of the Household Cavalry. The carriage containing the four Great Officers of State will be followed by the Hereditary Bearer of the St. Andrew's flag on horseback. Two divisions of the Sovereign's Escort will precede and two will follow the main section of the Procession.

The members of the Suite, the Dowager Duchess of Devonshire, the Lady Alice Egerton, the Right Hon. James Stuart, Secretary of State for Scotland, and Sir Alan Lascelles, will follow the Royal Carriage.

The Countess of Errol, Captain Viscount Althorp and Major Edward Ford and a Gold Stick for Scotland (the Earl of Stair) and Silver Stick for Scotland (the Duke of Buccleuch) will be in the final carriages.

The route of the Royal Procession to St. Giles will be by way of Abbeymount, Regent Road, Waterloo Place, Princes Street, the Mound and St. Giles Street. The processional route will be lined.

The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh arrive at Princes Street Station at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, June 23. A salute of twenty-one guns will be fired from Edinburgh Castle on the arrival of Her Majesty. The Lord Provost will present the Keys of the City. Presentations will be made by the Secretary of State for Scotland.

Her Majesty and His Royal Highness will drive in Royal Procession to the Palace of Holyroodhouse, proceeding by way of Princes Street, Waterloo Place, Regent Road, Abbeymount and Abbeyhill. The streets will be lined from the station to the Palace. At Holyrood Her Majesty will inspect the Guard of Homour provided by the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders and at 12.30 there will be a Fly Over by No. 603 Squadron, Royal Auxiliary Air Force.

The Lord Provost (Sir James Miller) will present the Keys of the City, saying:

"May it please Your Majesty, We, the Lord Provost, Magistrates and Council of the City of Edinburgh, have embraced the earliest moment of approaching Your Royal presence and welcoming Your Majesty to the Capital of Your ancient and hereditary kingdom of Scotland, and of offering for Your gracious acceptance, the Keys of Your Majesty's good town of Edinburgh."

Her Majesty will accept the Keys and return them to the safe keeping of the Lord Provost, saying:

"My Lord Provost, I return you these keys, being perfectly convinced that they cannot be placed in better hands than in those of the Lord Provost and Magistrates of my good City of Edinburgh."

The Lord Provost will present the Lady Provost who will present a bouquet to The Queen.
