To Katoomba, where the royal party makes a brief visit to beho Point and views the glorious Jamieson Valley, and the celebrated Three Sisters. In Sydney, the Duke makes an unexpected visit to the Cricket Groun. He sees the start of the Australian Mile Championship and, in dark glasses watches famous miles, John Landy, lead the field. Landy wins but on a rain-sodden

track fails to break his own record.

The City of Lithgow, New South Wales is gay today for the Queen's visit. On Arrival, the Queen and the Duke are escorted by Premier Cahill to their car for the drive through Lithgow. Sydney police help to control the crowds along the processional route. The Queen is welcomed by civic dignitaries, headed by the Lord Mayor, Alderman Harold Coates. There are over four thousand children in the city for this grand occasion. Royal visitors wend their way through the crowds to the dais, with its specially woven carpet, to meet leading citizens. Alderman Coates presents his speech of welcome. Her Majesty replies, saying that Lithgow's coal industry is making a notable contribution to Australia's strength. This little charmer, curtseying deeply, represents children who are here today from places as far distant as Mudgee and Kandos. The official ceremony over, Her Majesty and the Duke leave the dais and return to their car.

In gay spirits, the Queen is obviously enjoying her brief visit to

Lithgow.

Carnival crowds watch the royal car as it drives slowly on its way. Next stop Katoomba, and beyond that, an intensive and busy time as Her Majesty continues her tour of New South Wales.

But we hope the Queen is saying like these thousands who are cheering,

it's a lovely day in lithgow.

With pomp and ceremony, Camberra, the nation's capital, is on parade for the opening, by Her Majesty of the third session of 20th Parliament of the Commonwealth. It's a great moment for thousands of spectators, as the ween arrives at Parliament House and is met by the Prime Minister Mr. Menzies. 
