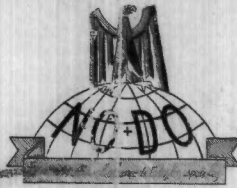

THE WEDDING OF PRINCESS MARIA PIA DE SAVOIA AND PRINCE ALEXANDER OF YUGOSLAVIA.

The small town of Cascaes, Portugal, is agog with expectation. A royal wedding is not an everyday event and the whole population turns out to catch a glimpse of the bride and the gorgeous bridal cortege. Beautiful girls donning the typical costumes of the different provinces of Italy, have come to render homage to Princess Maria Pia, daughter of ex-King Humbert of Italy, whose marriage to Prince Alexander of Yugoslavia is to be celebrated in the humble village church.

The bride leaves for the church accompanied by her father....

Members of different royal houses of Europe, of the Portuguese Cabinet and of the Diplomatic Corps were present during the ceremony. Because of the difference in religion of the bride and groom, Mass was not said; the parish-priest of Cascaes officiated in the wedding ceremony.

The groom's parents, King Simeon of Bulgaria, the Duchess of Kent, and the Earl and Countess of Barcelona were given places of honor, while the onethousand fivehundred Italian and two thousand foreign guests invited to the wedding took their places in the spaces marked for them.

The four small bells of the church merrily peal when the newly-married royal couple leave the church.... rockets are darted to the sky and three-thousand doves are set loose.

It is calculated that the wedding expenses have amounted to about one and a half million escudos. Movie stars from Hollywood, Rome and Paris have come to Cascaes to see the event and the world's most important news agencies have sent special correspondents to report it. Planes taking photographs have constantly flown over the main square of Cascaes. Special platforms had to be installed for the Press, photographers and cameramen.

The wedding feast was celebrated in the Palacio de Estoril Hotel. 1800 cars took the guests from Cascaes to Estoril. The feast was presided by the bride and groom with their parents, accompanied by the King of Bulgaria, the Duches of Kent, Duke and Duesess of Braganza, the Earl and Countess of Paris, Earl and Countess of Barcelona, and the Spanish Ambassador to Portugal, Don Nicolas Franco. In a nearby hotel, King Humbert, had ordered a special lunch for the chauffeurs of the guests. More than ten thousand strong witnessed the feast. After the banquet, all the inhabitants of the town were given cakes and drinks.
