... IT CARRIES WITH IT ALL THAT IS LOVABLE AND ALL THAT IS..... ALL THAT IS DEVOTIONAL SO FAR AS THE CITY OF GLASGOW IS CONCERNED.

I KNOW THAT YOU WILL LOOK UPON IT IN THE MANY YEARS THAT LIE BEFORE YOU WITH THAT KINDLINESS OF ASPECT AND THAT REMEMBRANCE OF THIS PARTICULAR DAY.

IT IS THE ONLY FUNCTION AT WHICH I HAVE PRESIDED, ON THIS OCCASION THE GRANTING OF THE FREEDOM OF THE CITY, AND I DON'T THINK I WILL PRESIDE AT ANOTHER ONE, BUT

I WANT TO SAY FOR MYSELF AS AN INDIVIDUAL THAT NOTHING IN MY CAREER AS LORD PROVOST OF GLASGOW HAS GIVEN ME MORE JOY , MORE COMFORT - CAN I FIND A MORE

SUITABLE WORD THAN 'JOY' - A MORE COMPLETE SATISFACTION OF MIND, ~~XXXXXXXX~~ THAT SATISFACTION AND PEACE OF MIND THAT PASSETH ALL UNDERSTANDING. NOTHING IN MY

CAREER AS LORD PROVOST HAS EXALTED OR PASSED THE FULLNESS THAT I HAVE TODAY.

IT IS THEREFORE WITH MORE THAN RESPECT, WITH MORE THAN DEVOTION I PASS IT OVER TO YOU FROM A PEOPLE WHO BELIEVE THAT GLASGOW WILL CONTINUE TO FLOURISH BY THE PREACHING OF THE WORD, AND THIS IS THEIR VERY VERY DEVOTIONAL OFFERING TO YOUR ROYAL HIGHNESS. (applause long sustained)

MY LD PROVOST, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN: THIS MOST GENEROUS GIFT OF THE FREEDOM OF THIS GT. ~~EXTY~~ AND HISTORIC CITY OF GLASGOW HAS GIVEN ME A VERY LARGE MEASURE OF QUITE UNDESERVED PLEASURE.

IT IS AN HONOUR - INDEED IT IS AN UNEXPECTED HONOUR - FOR WHICH I AM BOTH AND HUMBLY THANKFUL. I WILL NOT ATTEMPT TO GUESS AT THE REASONS THAT PROMPTED THIS GESTURE, BUT AS YOU SAID YOURSELF I LOOK UPON IT MUCH MORE THAN A CHARMING COMPLIMENT TO MYSELF; I PREFER TO SEE THIS CEREMONY AS AN EXPRESSION OF GLASGOW'S LOYALTY AND ADHERENCE TO THE IDEA OF A CONSTITUTIONAL MONARCHY AS IT WORKS IN THE U.K. TODAY. (applause)

I AM, FOR THE TIME BEING, A SMALL PART OF ITS FABRIC, AND IN HONOURING A PART YOU ACKNOWLEDGE THE WHOLE. [SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THE ROYAL FAMILY IN YEARS PAST HAVE HAD THE PRIVILEGE OF BEING FREEMEN OF THIS CITY, AND I WAS PARTICULARLY INTERESTED TO SEE THAT THE LAST DUKE OF EDINBURGH WAS GIVEN THE FREEDOM IN 1866, AND ON THAT OCCASION HE INAUGURATED, I UNDERSTAND, A STATUE IN GEORGE SQUARE. AT ONE TIME I WAS RATHER EXPECTING TO BE ASKED TO REVERSE HIS GOOD WORK (laugh and applause) BUT I AM GLAD TO SAY THAT BOTH THE STATUE AND I HAVE BEEN SPARED THAT ~~ANNOY~~ POSSIBILITY. THEREFORE NATURALLY AND QUITE RIGHTLY THE FREEDOM OF THIS CITY IS LOOKED UPON BY THOSE WHO GIVE IT AND THOSE WHO RECEIVE IT AS A VERY GREAT HONOUR INDEED, AND THE CEREMONY IS FULL OF CHARM AND DIGNITY, UNLIKE THE OWNERSHIP OF GLASGOW WHICH I UNDERSTAND CAN BE OBTAINED FOR A COUPLE OF DRINKS ON A SATURDAY NIGHT. (laugh and applause)
