

MAKARIOS LEAVES CYPRUS: ATHENS CROWDS PROTEST

Banners with anti-British slogans were very much in evidence in Athens soon after news came that Archbishop Makarios was not after all to visit the Greek capital. Big demonstrations protested against the exile of the Cyprus leader. Damage was done to many shops and buildings ~~and signs~~ in English. In Athens and Salonika more than 150 soldiers, students and police were injured before the day was out.

All this took place just before the Governor disclosed his hand and deported the Archbishop, with the Bishop of Kyrenia, another priest and an editor.
