FIRES.

The summer's first forest fire scorched the sportsman's paradise in Ocean County New Jersey threatening several towns and scores of families. Five hundred volunteers lent a hand to check the menace --- every fire department in the County was out on the job. / At Seattle fire-fighters were up against a different problem when a blaze broke out underneath the pier. A new invention was brought into use for the first time --- a floating hose that could be directed to any part of the fire. / And an oil well fire --- most difficult of all to stop once the flames have got a grip. In asbestos suits the firefighters work, right underneath the blazing derrick which collapses on them even as they work. / Years of experiment have shown that an oil well fire can be blown out by explosive --- so watch!
