Competing for the "ing's Cup were British yachts of the twelvemetre class, most fancied among them being MF T.O.M.Sopwith's Tum

Tomahawk. Mr Sopwith's great rival Mr Vanderbilt was not eligible
to compete with his American yacht Vin. Dut to the landsman's eyes
there is more in this than rivalry and the race for a coveted
prize. There is the levely aspect of white sails upon the sea
in a fair breeze that drives the clouds like yachts in the sky above.
The course is two laps --- by Calahott and Bramble buoy, a distance
of twenty-seven miles.

Tomahawk was the winner, beating Evaine by 5 minutes --- and she gained the reputation of being the best British yacht of this year.
