The whole British Empire, and Canada in particular, has mastain sustained a heavy loss by the death in Montreal of Canada's Governor General, Lord Tweedsmuir. Although he had held his title for six years, Lord Tweedsmuir was still better known to the world at large as John Buchan. For he made his name first as a novelist, his best-known work being "The Thirty-Nine Steps." He was also at one time the head of Reuters News Agency. It was in 1934 that Lord Tweedsmuir became Gevernor General of Canada, and during his term of office he devoted himself whole-heartedly to the welfare of the Bemitanx Dominion. He won the respect and affection of all classes of Canadians, and he strengthened the already firm bonds of friendship between the Dominion and the United States.
