FINLAND.

The gallant little army of Finland continues to put up a supreme defence against the overwhelming masses of the Russian steam-roller. <sup>^</sup> These latest pictures from the scene of operations show the Finnish ski-patrol trying to glean a little warmth before setting out on a specially hazardous job. These troops are particularly selected for their courage and their task is to destroy the enemy patrols. In the bitter cold of the endless Arctic winter- they travel in lorries to the front line. Deep snow cushions trees and earth alike, and with a temperature 30 below, it's a tough proposition for even these hardy sons of the North. But Finland has set the world a magnificent example of unflinching bravery in the face of tremendous odds- and she will go through with it to the bitter end- never counting the cost.
