

INCENDIARY BOMBS.

This is an incendiary bomb. It takes fire on impact and may burn fifteen minutes; and will ignite anything in its vicinity. The stirrup handpump is the best to deal with both bomb and fire. The barrel is placed in the bucket while another person runs out the hose. The nozzle can be adjusted to give a jet for use on the fire; and a spray for use on the bomb itself. When using the jet, pump at sixty five double strokes a minute; thirty five for the spray. Keep low to attack the fire. There's less heat and smoke. The Browns at home. Suddenly- the alarm. Enemy aircraft are here. But the Browns are prepared to tackle the worst. An incendiary bomb hits the house. It burns very violently for the first minute but after that it can be tackled. Brown goes to ^{find out} ~~ascertain~~ the damage, and sends to Smith next door ^{for} the pump they share. There is no panic. A bucket, always kept full, is placed outside the front door. Miss Smith arrives. She has received training from the local authorities, which you too can receive. Brown decides to operate the pump away from the heat and smoke. PAUSE.

Note how Miss Smith keeps as near the floor as possible- and plays a jet of water on the heart of the fire to get it under control. Brown junior calls the fire brigade. Bust in case. While the spray is on the bomb the surroundings are kept wet and the bomb is doing no more damage. You notice Miss Smith is alternately using jet and spray. Three or four families can club together to share the cost of the pump,
