LORD HALIFAX ON BOARD "KING GEORGE V"

Our cameraman sailed in the world's latest and greatest battleship with Lord Halifax when the former Foreign Secretary crossed the Atlantic as Ambassador to Washington. H.M.S. King George V. --- thirty-five thousand-ton giant, armed and armoured as no other warship has ever been. The pride of the Royal Navy - the terror of our enemies.

The appointment of a member of the British war Cabinet to the Embassy in America was a step without precedent, but the importance of his task is thereby emphasized. President Roosevelt gave the world evidence of his sense of its importance when he sailed in his yacht Potomac to welcome Britain's envoy.

The guns fired in salute. And though the weather in the Bay was a mixture of rain and fog, that was only in keeping with the mist of secrecy which had shrouded the voyage. Threats and rumours encircle the globe --- there is talk of new wars blowing in every corner of it. But the Navy stands like the
