GENERAL DE GAULLE INSPECTS HIS AIRMEN.

Somewhere in Scotland the leader of the Free French paid a visit to an air force station where his country-men are carrying on the fight. Many of them have several Nazis to their credit. Receipt of these pictures coincides with the opening of the trial of former leaders of France on a charge that is described as "war-guilt."

The story of France in this war is so complex: that much of it is hard to understand. The men of Bordeaux and Vichy who sold a great mation for a precarious personal security will be remembered with shame for ever. But these are Frenchmen who know that war guilt rests on Germany --- and on those who now do Germany's work.
