THE WAR IN THE PACIFIC.

From the Office of Admiral Chester Nimitz, Commander-in-Chief of the United States Pacific Fleet, go orders for new attacks upon the Japanese. The massing of Allied sea power to crush the enemy in the Central Pacific.

From a jungle headquarters-post in the Solomon Islands is flashed the signal for aircraft support in a drive on the island of BOUGAINVILLE during the reduction of Jap bases in this area.

Intensive shelling and bombing of the enemy positions around Empress Augusta Bay. 40,000 Japanese on the Island are attacked.

It's another job for the U.S. Marines. Reinforcements pour ashore through a heavy surf. The landings are part of the comprehensive allied plan to create a great two-thousand five hundred mile arc of ~~new~~ strategic Island bases, focused on the strong Japanese Naval Base on the Island of TRUK in the Carolines.

Jungle Fighters in mottled green. Camouflaged Australians and Americans penetrate into the interior. Success on BOUGAINVILLE was hard won, but it means another jumping off place. and one more stepping stone nearer Japan.
