Newmarket

A big field of 34 runners was out at Newmarket for the Cambridgeshire Handicap. French horses have already taken the year's racing honours. This race brought Newmarket's biggest-ever crowd to watch yet another challenge from over the channel.

The field soon split into three groups. Horse to watch was French-owned Sayani. Carrying 9 stone 4, (biggest weight of any Cambridgeshire winner) Sayani's backers got 25 to 1.

Favourite "Langton Abbott" carried the money, but when the crowd closed in on the rails at the last stretch they got another racegoer's shock. Sayani wins, with the Aga Khan's "Clare" nearest the rails, second, and the Grey "Toronto" third.
