Exit

In Bombay, Governor-General Earl Mountbatten says "Goodbye" to the first British troops to leave India. The Mountbattens flew from New Delhi to give the 5,000 servicemen their personal farewell messages. The men were drawn from the 2nd Battalion Royal Norfolk Regiment and several R.A.F. squadrons. Lord Louis paid tribute to them.

Indian sailors were there to bring the troops farewell greetings from the new Dominion. Sikh soldiers, wartime comrades of the British forces, lined Ballard pier as the Georgis got ready to leave.

Field Marshal Auchinleck and senior Indian army officers were also at the dockside with the Governor-General. The rest of the British troops will leave India as soon as possible.
