

KOREABRITISH HELP TO HOLD TAEJU

Near Taegu British troops have their last hot meal before going into the line. Yes, Armys still march on their stomachs. In a desperate effort to stop Red attacks American tanks are manoeuvred up earth ramps to use their guns as long-range artillery against massed North Korean forces. The tanks open up a barrage in which every kind of available weapon joins.
