U.N. DRIVE TO HAN RIVER

For the fourth time in the Korean War the Han River - now frozen - becomes the front line. After smashing one of the fiercest Chinese attacks of the campaign, United Nations forces move up towards Seoul.

Back to the bridge they've twice wrecked and re-built, back to the road they knew so well, whilst over-head squadrons of huge Flying Boxcars supply other units advanced well ahead of bases. And, flying with them, the newreel cameraman secures unusual pictures of a massed drop of urgent supplies.

Back on the Han, British and American tanks open up on Seoul itself. But taking towns is no longer the aim. Today's strategy is to kill the enemy at minimum cost till he tires of aggression.
