CYCLIST CHAMPIONSHIPS

MILAN, Aug. 27 - Italy's Enzo Sacchi and Great Britain's Reginald Harris respectively won the world's championships of amateur and professional speed bicycle racing last night, as 15.000 spectators roared their approval at the Vigorelli Velodrome.

Sacchi won in a three-way duel with his countryman Renzo Morettini and Australian R. Mockridge, flashing over the finish line in 11.4 seconds for the last 200 meters of the track.

Harris vanquished the Frenchman Jacques Bellenger and S. Patterson of Australia in 11.4 seconds just a few minutes later.

MILAN, Aug. 28 - Nino de Rossi of Italy yesterday won the amateur pursuit of the World Cycling Championships here, by beating Belgium's Raphael Glorieux.

The winner's time over the four-kilometer (2.5 miles) course, was five minutes, five and eight-tenths seconds at an average speed of 47.90 KPH (29.10 MPH).

Glorieux's time was five minutes 15 seconds.
