DISASTERS AT SEA

At Pendeen, Cornwall, the Liberian carge-ship "Liberty" blases after three explosions. With 400 tens of coal in her bunkers, the ship looks doomed as firemen from Pensance, Falmouth and St. Just arrive to take a hand. Small pertable pumps are run enboard. When the "Liberty" ran aground in a gale, Patho showed dramatic exclusive rescue pictures. Salvage operations were in hand when the fire broke out, and one theory is that an exygen cylinder expleded. As our pictures were being taken rescuers were in process of saving the ship's cat.

In the Atlantic off Cape God, the stern section of the tanker "Pendleton," (broken away from the bow in a furious stern) rells helplessly. Thirty-two men were rescued, one was drowned. Wine stayed enboard.

Pifteen miles away our Geast Guard plane skims over the bow section wrecked on a sheal. There were eight men on this part when the sterm ripped the "Pendleten" apart ... new all eight are believed to be dead.
