THROUGHOUT THE AFTERNOON AMERICAN RESCUE SQUADS FIREMEN
AMBULANCE MEN AND POLICE WORKED FEVERISHLY ON THE SMOKING
RUBBLE OF THE BANK, THE IRONMONGERS SHOP AND FLATS SEARCHING
FOR THE BODIES OF MR WILLIAM READ 79 AND HIS WIFE EVELYN 55
WHO ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN TRAPPED WHEN THE AIRCRAFT DEMOLISHED
THEIR HOME.

THE IRONMONGER'S SHOP WHICH MR READ HAS KEPT SINCE 1935
LLOYDS BANK, PREMISES ADJOINING AND FLATS ABOVE WERE COMPLETELY
DEMOLISHED BY FLAMES FROM THE SCATTERED PETROL.

THE PILOT OF THE THUNDER JET WHO WAS KILLED IN THE CRASH WAS
CAPTAIN CLIFFORD FROGGARTY, 29, OF THE 123RD FIGHTER BOMBER WING,
U.S.A.A. FORCE, BASED AT MANSTON.

CAPTAIN FROGGARTY, A MARRIED MAN WITH ONE CHILD, WAS A
NATIVE OF NEW YORK. HE ONLY CAME TO ENGLAND IN NOVEMBER LAST.
DEREK SOUTHEE, 8, OF OXFORD, ON HOLIDAY WITH HIS UNCLE, MR
ARMSWORTH, OF HIGH STREET, ST.PETERS, WAS PLAYING IN AN OR-
CHARD 20 YARDS AWAY WHEN THE PLANE CRASHED. BURNING PETROL WAS
SPRAYED OVER HIM AND SET FIRE TO HIS SHIRT AND CLOTHING. HE WAS
TAKEN TO HOSPITAL SUFFERING FROM BURNS.

MR READ SERVED WITH THE CANADIAN ARMY IN THE FIRST WORLD WAR,
AND TODAY HIS MARRIED DAUGHTER, JOYCE LUMLEY AND HER HUSBAND
BERNARD ARRIVED IN CANADA WHERE THEY EMIGRATED TEN DAYS AGO.
THEY DECIDED TO GO ABROAD BECAUSE THEY WERE UNABLE TO OBTAIN A
HOUSE IN LONDON.

4-10 PM . THE QUEEN AT SCOUTS PARADE

IN BRILLIANT SUNSHINE TODAY THE QUEEN, FOR THE FIRST TIME, TOOK
THE SALUTE AT THE ANNUAL PARADE AND NATIONAL SCOUT SERVICE IN
ST GEORGE'S CHAPEL WINDSOR .

THE SERVICE WAS INAUGURATED BY HER GRANDFATHER IN
1935.

HER MAJESTY WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE DUKE OF EDINBURGH AND
PRINCESS MARGARET .

THE PARADE, HEADED BY THE BAND OF THE HORSE GUARDS IN FULL
DRESS UNIFORM MARCHED THROUGH THE STREETS OF WINDSOR TO THE
GREAT QUADRANGLE IN THE CASTLE WHERE THE QUEEN WAS WAITING .

BEFORE THE ARRIVAL OF THE PARADE HER MAJESTY INSPECTED INTER-
NATIONAL SCOUT REPRESENTATIVES FROM ALL PARTS OF THE EMPIRE AND FROM
SOME FOREIGN COUNTRIES . SHE ALSO INSPECTED AND SPOKE TO
REPRESENTATIVE HANDICAPPED SCOUTS .

THE PARADE MOVED OFF TO ST GEORGE'S CHAPEL AFTER THE
INSPECTION.
