DUKE WINS CRAND PRIX.

32 of Europe's ace moter-cyclists get away for the start of the 500 c.e. German Grand Prix held at Stuttgart. With stars like Geoff Duke Ray Amm, Ferhus Anderson and Reg Armstreng in the race, it promises to be a thrill-e-second battle. The hot sun has melted spots of tar on the circuit so the going won't be easy.

Soon, the riders begin to sort themselves out. Geoff Duke, number One, takes his Gilera, into the lead. Ray Amm is close behind. The Grand Prix totals 128 miles.

On the tenth lap, Ray Ann moves into the lead. Armstrong is up with the leaders. The pace is het, and Duke has already cracked the lap record with a speed of 91.6. miles an hour.

Duke's back in first place again, with Ray Amm a close second.

Looks like Fergus Anderson will have to be content with fifth place. They're
on the last lap now.

Its still, Duke, followed by Amm - and up they come to the finish in that order, Duke's great victory, won at an average speed of 89.53 miles an hour, puts the world championship title within his grasp once again.
