CARDIFF - CITY FREEDOM FOR DUKE.

Within Cardiff City-Hall, His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh takes his place on a dais before more than a thousand townspeople. He is to be granted the highest honour Cardiff can bestow upon any man - namely the freedom of the City. Two years ago, the council agreed that the Duke should become the city's 48th Freeman. Now he signs the scroll that admits him to this high office. Her Majesty the Queen is the only lady to have been granted this same honour. Now, from the hands of the Lord Mayor, the Duke receives the Scroll of Freemanship.

Applause greets the Duke as he begins his speech of thanks.

A service at the Welsh National War Memorial is another engagement for Prince Philip, who again wears the dress uniform of the Welsh Guards, of which he is Colonel in Chief.

Men of the British Legion are not forgotten by His Royal Highness. Many of them saw service with the Welsh Guards. The climax of the Duke's visit to the Memorial, which honours the dead of two world wars, comes when he lays a wreath of red poppies.
