## PORTRALT OF "MINERS" KNIGHT.

In a humble street at Hoyland, Barnsley, Sir Thomas Toulinson was bern seventy-eight years ago. At the age of twelve he left school and began work in a coal-mine. Since that time he has become one of the most respected public figures in that part of the country.

At Blaccar Colliery, Sir Thomas worked for nearly forty years. In addition to his work there, he became a J.P: later he was elected to the County Council of which he is now the Chairman. For his services to the community, he was knighted last year. How, at the Minor's Welfare Hall in Heyland, the Earl of Searberough presents him with a portrait:
