**RAMSES II STATUE REMOVED TO STAND IN CAIRO**

The giant statue of Egypt's Pharaoh RAMSES the Second which had been standing for the past six thousand years at MIT RAHINA near Sakmara was removed the other day, and with the help of a trailer lent by the British Army, brought by road to Cairo, where it will now stand on the main Station Square.

A crowd of people had gathered around the site at Mit Rahina to look on while preparations were made for removal of the colossal stone statue. Most of them were sad, and protested against the removal of the old King who was still bringing them wealth through the tourists coming to see it.

The bridges along the road to Cairo had to be reinforced and enlarged for the passage of the enormous trailer. But finally RAMSES II arrived safely in Cairo where he will stand on one of the Egyptian's capital's main squares.
