RAMSES II STATUE REMOVED TO STAND IN CAIRO Masruff material Positive developed 44 meters = 147 ft

The giant statue of Egypt's Pharaon RAMSES the Second which had been standing fow the past six thousand years at MIT RAHIMA near Sakkara was removed the other day, and with the help of a trailer lent by the British Alber, brought by read to Cairo, where it will now stand on the main Station Square.

A crowd of people had gathered around the site at Mit Mahine to look on while preparations were made for removal of the colessal stone statue. Most of them were sad, and protested against the removal of the old King who was still bringing them wealth through the tourists coming to see it.

Two bridges along the road to Cairo had to be reinforced and enlarged for the passage of the enormous trailer. But finally RAMSES II arrived safely in Cairo where he will stand on one of the Egyptian's capital's main squares.
