Girl in a million Barbara Porritt, and migrant one million and one, husband Dennis, arrive in Melbourne - the end of a 12,000 mile voyage to their new home. She's officially the one millionth migrant since the war. Aboard the Oransay, 50 press, radio and newsreel men literally mob the Yorkshire lass, and Immigration Minister Holt gives an official welcome.
