

B.9616 is one of the recordings of the wedding of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth and that due to the very special circumstances under which The Gramophone Co. were permitted to make such recordings, it will be quite impossible for them to authorise the use of this particular record in a film.

The other record, H.M.V. C. 2904, can be available in so far as the dubbing is concerned. We now have to await advice as to whether "CAPRIOL SUITE" by Warlock can be cleared.

With regard to "A LITTLE CHILD ON THE EARTH HAS BEEN BORN", the words are the copyright of Oxford University Press, our Members, and can be cleared, but the music belongs to Mrs. Ingrid Rontgen of BILTHOVEN. We are writing to her for you.
