This is near Fort Greeley, Alaska, where ten thousand G.I.s are testing their equipment and themselves — learning to keep going where there are no roads and no landmarks.

Huge Air Force cargo planes parachute four hundred tons of supplies to the ground forces.

This is "Exercise Mossehorn," four hundred miles morthwest of the Canadian border. Both Air Force and Army have teamed up to crack the tough military problems of mobility, transportation and supply in the white wastelands of America's frozen Arctic frontier.
