

PRESIDENT TITO VISITS A COLLECTIVE FARM.

On touring through the Southern Regions of the Soviet Union, Josip Broz Tito, President of the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia, his wife, Nikita Khrushchov, Member of the USSR Supreme Soviet Presidium and First Secretary of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, and Anastas Mikoyan, First Vice-Chairman of the USSR Council of Ministers visit a collective farm at the Cossack village of Grigoriopolinskaya of Stavropol Region.

Thousands of collective farmers line the village streets to welcome the guests.

According to a traditional Russian custom, one of the oldest collective farmers greets the President of the Federative People's Republic of Yugoslavia with a loaf of bread and salt. Later at the Collective Farm's summer theatre a public meeting is held. Speeches are made by Josip Broz Tito, Anastas Mikoyan and Nikita Khrushchov.
