MANIFESTATIONS PRO-HUNGARY

Students of Rome and Milan have loudly manifested against the massacre of the Hungarian patriots.

In Rome, at Piazza Venezia a long procession of students carrying Italian and Hungarian banners and placards exalting the Free Hungary was formed. The manifesting youth went along the streets of the centre of the town. On the placards the inscriptions read as follows :

- O ROMA O MOSCA ( Or Rome or Moscow )
- VIVA L'UNGHERIA ( Long live Hungary )
- LIBERTA' ALL'UNGHERIA ( Freedom to Hungary )

Hanged from gallows, a puppet looking like Stalin.

Other placards were bearing the following inscriptions ;

- MORTE AI PORCI RUSSI ( DEATH FOR THE RUSSIAN SWINE )
- ABBASSO LA RUSSIA ( Down with Russia )
- LE GLORIOSE VITTIME DELL'UNGHERIA INDICANO LA VIA DEL SACRIFICIO E DELL'ONORE A TUTTA L'EUROPA ( The glorious victims of Hungary show the way of sacrifice and honour to the whole Europe )

When the procession reached the communist publishing house UESISA editing the communist newspaper " IL PAESE " the students tried to assault and smash the newspaper's windows.

The police were then obliged to intervene, pursuing the students up to the near Piazza Venezia where an attempt to disperse the manifestation was without result. The students had barricaded themselves on the steps of the monument of the Unknown Warrior and the Police had some difficulty in clearing them out of the place.

In Milan the students were parading manifesting their own indignation for the Hungarian deeds. A more disciplined procession went along the streets of the capital town of Lombardy bearing too many placards exalting the Free Hungary and several Hungarian banners
