

NEW PASSENGER PLANES

Our cameraman visited the Vnukovo Airfield in Moscow, where new planes of civil aviation are being displayed. The plane "UKRAINA", designed by O.K. Antonov, can make long-distance flights at an altitude of up to eight kilometres (5 miles). The plane can accommodate eighty-four passengers.

The "TU-104" is designed by A.N. Tupolev.

It has four turbo-jet engines. The machine has a maximum speed of 1,000 kilometres per hour.

The plane "ROSKVA", designed by S.V. Ilyushin, is intended to transport 75-100 passengers.

These new passenger planes will soon be put into service on Soviet airlines.

Heads of a number of diplomatic representations accredited to the U.S.S.R. and Military Attaches arrive at the Vnukovo Airfield to see the new planes.

They are met and shown about by the aircraft designers Ilyushin and Antonov, Assistant General Constructor, Yeger, and Assistant head of the Main Office of the Civil Air Fleet under the Council of Ministers of the U.S.S.R., Bakharov.

HIS MAJESTY KING MOHAMMED ZAHIR SHAH OF AFGHANISTAN

CALLS ON KLIMENT VOROSHILOV AND NIKOLAI BULGANIN

On July the 18th His Majesty King Mohammed Zahir Shah of Afghanistan calls on Kliment Voroshilov, President of the U.S.S.R. Supreme Soviet Presidium, at the Kremlin.

The King is accompanied by Afghan officials who have arrived with him.

Mikhail Gorbachev, Secretary of the USSR Supreme Soviet Presidium, Andrei Gromyko, Soviet Foreign Minister, and other officials are present.

On that same day His Majesty calls on Nikolai Bulganin, Chairman of the Council of Ministers of the U.S.S.R.,.

Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko and other officials of the U.S.S.R. Foreign Ministry are present.
