Dear Mr. Martin,

The following is the additional information you require regarding live activities at the Exhibition:-

1. Demonstrations of activities in individual sections of the Exhibition.

The Education Section of the Exhibition is made up of different sections each dealing with a different stage of education. These range from the Nursery Schools Section to the Universities and Adult Education. In several of these sections there will be a live demonstration going on throughout most of each day. The demonstrations are in the following sections:-

- A. Junior Schools - where young children will be carrying out a variety of their normal school activities.
- B. Grammar School Science Bay - where sixth former's and senior pupils will be carrying out experiments in Physics and Chemistry.
- C. Secondary Modern and Housecraft Bay - in which girls from Secondary Modern Schools will be demonstrating in housecraft and cookery.
- D. The Special Schools - children from schools for the blind, the deaf, and delicate, will be seen doing their normal school work.
- E. Technical College Section - here students from Colleges of Advanced Technology will be doing experiments in control engineering and optics in industry, while students from Art Colleges will be designing dress, shoes and millinery, and making and modelling them. Over-head, art students will be painting a mural.
- F. Adult Education - Here men and women from a wide variety of Adult Education organisations e.g. Women's Institutes, Townswomen's Guilds, Evening Institutes, and the Worker's Educational Associations will be giving demonstrations of various activities.

2. Demonstration Class Theatre.

Here there will be a big programme of demonstration in which full classes will be given lessons by their teachers in a wide variety of school subjects. Other demonstrations will be put on by students from Training Colleges and Technical Colleges, and Youth Service and Adult groups. Children will be seen taking lessons with the aid of Schools television and radio, and there will be a special series of demonstration lectures using closed circuit television.

In these various demonstration activities and the programme of events in the Main Theatre, more than 4,000 children, students and teachers will be taking part.


