

BRITISH CAR'S GREAT FEATS.

Famous Bonneville Salt Flats was the scene of the M.G.'s attack on the flying mile and other records; engine, fifteen hundred and six c.c. Phil Hill eased himself into the tailor-made driving seat. He's an American; member of the Ferrari Grand Prix team; well known in Europe. In charge was veteran speed king George Siston. He gave the okay to go, though rain had softened the salt on the 12-mile straight. More rain was expected, so it was now or never. The electric timers were all set as the car reared on its way.

Time for the first run indicated records smashed by big margins, from the kilometre to ten miles. Now Hill went all out again.

The flying mile was pushed up by 70 m.p.h. to 254.53; other records correspondingly.

George Siston warmly congratulated Phil Hill on his fine achievements.
