LOCATION. CAPE TOWN.

SHOTS. ROLL N° 1.

1. M.L.S. Portion of Table Mountain with clouds sweeping over the summit known as the table cloth.
2. View portion of Cape Town from the slopes of Table Mountain in residential area.
3. M.L.S. Portion of Table Mountain with table cloth (as Shot 1.)
4. G.V. of portion of Cape Town & Table Mountain with table cloth from Doeh area.
5. G.V. Cape Town with Duncan Doeh in foreground & Table Mountain in background.
6. At R.F. Malan Airport Cape Town, the Guard of Honour marching with S.A. naval band into position on tarmac, the Guard of Honour is a detachment of S.A. Air Force.
7. Various views of general set-up at Aerodrome awaiting arrival of Mr Macmillan including section of crowds.
8. Mr Macmillan's aircraft taking in, seen passing large Union Jack in foreground.
9. Another angle plane arriving on tarmac.
10. Mr Macmillan seen standing at ~~entrance~~ door of aircraft.
(Telephoto shot.)
11. Mr Macmillan descends ~~steps~~ gangway from Aircraft
(Run Out)

There is a gap here owing to jam on roll N° 2.

ROLL N° 2.SHOT

1. At aerodrome Dr H.F. Verwoerd the Prime Minister of South Africa delivering his address of welcome to Mr Macmillan.
2. Mr Macmillan replies.
3. C.V.s of scene while Macmillan is speaking (various shots)
4. Mr Macmillan walks towards crowds & waves. (several shots)
- 5/6 Lady Dorothy waving to crowds.
7. Shot of crowds clapping Mr Macmillan
- 8/9 Mr Macmillan instead of proceeding through the airport building as arranged walks over to the crowd lining the fence and greets them, he walks along edge of crowd greeting them as he moves along, the official cars are diverted & pick him up at another entrance to ~~the~~ tarmac. Camera with telephoto lens follows movement.

LOCATION Cape Town + Countryside.

ROLL N°1.PLUSX

SHOTS.

- 1/2 shots South African Houses of Parliament Cape Town where Mr Macmillan addressed members of both houses.
3. G.V. Houses of Parliament from high angle showing Devil's Peak + Table Mountain in background then panning down to Parliament House.
4. View showing section of city with Lion's Head in background.
5. High angle view looking down on group of people on pavement listening to Mr Macmillan's speech with the aid of a small pocket-radio.
6. Crowd at fence waiting for Mr Macmillan to come out of Parliament House.
- 7/8 Mr Macmillan in company of Dr. Verwoerd (SA Prime Minister) comes out and descends steps of Parliament House but he stands at the top of the steps first & waves to crowd waiting to see him and lining the fence.
- 9/10. Shot of crowd at fence ~~very~~ waving & cheering Mr Macmillan.
11. Crowd in Parliament Street which had gathered to see the PM's car pass. (They are just dispersing).
- 12/14 Views of "Goote Schuur" where Mr Macmillan is staying with Dr Verwoerd.

End of Roll.

ROLL No 2.ILFORD EP3.SHOTS.

1. Mr Macmillan (wearing bush hat with leopard skin band)
Chatting on steps of "Groot Schuur" The British High
Commissioner (to John Hume) & Dr Verwoed are present.
^{Also Mr Sauer (Minister of Lands etc)}
2. Mr Macmillan & party descend steps to ~~and~~ get into
waiting cars, Lady Dorothy is also seen & approaches
camera to get in a separate car.
3. The procession as they leave "Groot Schuur" with mounted
Traffic Inspectors leading.
4. Mr Macmillan's car passing camera with others following.
5. Several shots of groups of people & children in Pinelands
a Cape Town suburb waving as the procession of cars pass.
6. At one of the beauty spots along the road Mr Macmillan
& party alight from cars to admire the view of
vineyards against mountain background. (several shots)
7. The Prime Minister's party arrive at the French Huguenot
monument at Franschhoek & Mr Macmillan with
Mr Sauer are seen admiring it. Some view upward of
~~the Macmillan~~ monument.
8. Mr Macmillan is seen chatting to President of Huguenot
Monument Society (not sure of correct designation)
9. Ditto rear view with monument in background.
10. Views of mountains etc.
11. Picturesque angle of lily pond, & portion of monument
with pan up to one of the surrounding mountains.
12. At Paarl a general view from farm ~~house~~ house window
showing vineyards in foreground and the K.W.V. winery
in middle distance, with mountain background.
13. Another view of vineyards with a silver leaf tree in foreground & the
famous Paarl rock on top of hill in background. Paarl means pearl
& the name is taken from this rock which shines when wet.

SUBJECT. THE MACMILLAN'S VISIT TO CAPE TOWN.

While Mr Macmillan had private discussions with the South African Prime Minister, Lady Dorothy visited the Malay quarter in Cape Town and one of the coloured quarters in a suburban area.

1. The residence of Mr N. Abrahams a Malay businessman where Lady Dorothy & party were to be entertained to morning tea.
2. View of Upper Leavenworth street showing row of Malay houses belonging to the better class of Malays.
3. This should be a shot of a group of placards displayed by a group of Coloured & Malays representing some non-white society.
4. The Malay chief priest Sheikh Achmed Bekhardien arrives in his robes & ascends the steps to Mr Abrahams' house.
- 5/6 Lady Dorothy's car arrives, she alights and ascends steps of house which she enters etc.
- 7/8 Interior shots in house, Lady Dorothy being presented with bouquet of flowers by little girls and the party having morning tea with most excellent assortment of cakes & pastries all home made. The gentleman standing at end of table ~~and now~~ is Mr Abrahams, Lady Dorothy is seated next to Mrs Abrahams. (Two angles taken.)
9. Group on verandah of house showing Lady Dorothy with Malay ladies in their beautiful national costumes. Lady Dorothy ~~is~~ wearing a Malay straw hat.

SHOTS.

10. Lady ~~James~~ Dorothy leaves and descends steps.
11. Group of Malay ladies gathered on veranda wave good bye to Lady Dorothy.
- 12 ^{1/3} Lady Dorothy & party arrive at Mr George Peteren's house at Athlone. Mr Peteren is a coloured business man. The coloureds are a distinct race of mixed blood, in otherword they are half casts. Some are very dark & others are very light skinned and appear as Europeans. Many of the better class coloureds are fine people, while others are of a degraded type of human. The shots show the visiting party being welcomed.
14. Shot from high angle C.V. of Mr Peteren's house with the honoured guests inside.

ROLL No 2. ILFORD FP3.

1. View of road bridge over railway. This used to be a level crossing & Mr Peteren's son was killed in an accident while crossing. When the authorities decided to build a bridge Mr Peteren presented the ground on which the bridge stands in remembrance of his son.
- 2 ^{1/3} Interior at tea table Lady Dorothy is replying to a speech of welcome delivered by Mrs Peteren. Mr Peteren is seen seated at table opposite camera. Some of the party having tea.
4. A good looking coloured girl with her baby a relative of the family.
5. A group of coloured ladies (Types).
6. Lady Dorothy on leaving poses for photographs.

7. Lady Dorothy leaves walking to gate etc.
8. Lady Dorothy before entering car is presented with a bouquet of flowers by little coloured girl.
- 9/10 The car moves off & a group of coloureds on roadside are seen waving good bye.
11. Shot of more humble type of houses in Malay Quarter, these are very old houses of Cape type.
12. Scenic view of Camps Bay & portion of mountains known as the Twelve Apostles. The Macmillans will drive through this on their round the mountain trip during the afternoon.
13. The balance of roll is of scenic views in the Hout Bay & Chapman's Peak area regarded as one of the world's finest marine drives.

ROLL NO 3.

1. Scenic views Chapman's Peak area.
2. The Macmillans' procession of cars pass along the scenic road.
3. A tea party is given by the Administrator of the Cape Province at Groot Constantia a famous old Dutch house once the residence of the Dutch Governor of the Cape. It is now a National Monument & a great tourist attraction.
Mr Macmillan is seen having guests. Presented to him & there are views of the garden party & scenes ~~at~~ of the fine old homestead.
