In Frankfort the XII. Book publishers with 70,000 books. Two thirds came from abroad - 39 even from the communistic east German provinces.

The peak of the four fair was the award of the Peace Prize of the German Rublishing Trade to the British publisher Victor Gollancz in the Pauls Church.

Gollancz - his father was a rabbi - came to defeated Germany in 1945 - and with spectacher tolerance afforded aid to that post-nazi Germany. He founded the organization "save Europe now" and gave his personal untiring and to the "Agency for Spiritual Help in Germany". In his book "In darkest Germany" for the first time after the war an Englishman solicited understanding for Germany. He derided the general collective, but meaningless designation fof "the Germans" - Gollancz made it clear in the West that in Germany, too, humans - just simple humans, were living as everywhere in the world.

We Germans thank this brave man - a conspicious example of the independent British personality.
