

BOW BELLS PEAL AGAIN

At St. Mary-le-Bow, London's most famous bells are heard again. They came tumbling down in the Blitz of May, 1941, but the metal was saved, and now, recast as a peal of twelve, the historic Bow Bells are restored to London. To the Dedication Service came the Duke of Edinburgh. The Lord Mayor received him for this was a City of London occasion, as well as a religious ceremony. The Bishop of London and the Rector of the church welcomed the Duke at the West Door.

Londoners for whom there was no room in the church awaited the sound of the bells, which have not been heard for 22 years. The Duke rang the great "Bell of Bow" and the historic peal sounded again.
