Onto the old "barrer" they go, while Lupino Lane goes hunting from house to house down Lambeth Way.

And here's what he wants it for. To add to the millions of worn and unwanted gamophone records which are needed for the recovery of shellac; an essential commodity in the manufacture of records. The broken pieces are pulverised and the dust fed onto heated rollers which produce the plastic base for new discs. After passing through a variety of processes, the sheets of basic material ultimately emerge as new records under the giant presses which turn out the finished article. These are destined to play an important part in war. Factories, Hospitals and our men in enemy prison camps will profit by the response to this appeal.
