COVENTRY'S BISHOP ENTHRONED.

The enthronement of the fourth Bishop of the restored See of Goventry takes place amid the ruins of the Gathedral destroyed in the terrible raid of November 1940.

The Bishop elect, Dr. Neville Gorton, demands admittance by knocking at the West door with his Staff.

The opened doors reveal the roofless and destroyed interior. From here the procession passes down the nave lined with piles of ruined stone blocks, which once were the glary of Goventry's Cathedral. You will see, when the Lord Bishop reaches the episcopal seat, hew a cross made from charred beams stands above the dismantled high altar.
