- 2, M.S. The Bishop elect, Dr. Neville Gorton nears West door and knocks on it with his Staff. 28
- 3, V.S. The processions moves towards the altar. 42
- 4, V.S. Broken windows and walls of the cathedral. 10
- 5, M.S. The rough cross of Coventry made of charred wood. 8
- 6, V.S. Dr. Gorton receiving the blessing and being enthroned as the new Bishop. He replies S.O.F. with a blessing. 120

SALUTE TO THE RED ARMY

- 1, M.S. Naval cadets pulling gun carriage past saluting base at the start of the procession through Bristol. 30
- 2, M.S. Mr A.V. Alexander, First Lord of the Admiralty taking salute. 4
- 3, V.S. Soldiers and other arms of the services march past. 30
- 4, M.S. Mr Attlee taking salute in Cardiff. 4
- 5, V.S. Men and women of the army and a R.A.F. unit march past. 28
- 6, V.S. Red Army officer Major Leberdov takes salute at a march past in Manchester. 27
- 7, M.S. Sir Stafford Cripps taking salute and parade through Sheffield. Sailors lead the parade past. 45
- 8, V.S. Ceremony in the Royal Albert Hall at which all nations flags are paraded onto the stage to pay tribute to the U.S.S.R. 81
- 9, M.S. Mr Eden speaking S.O.F. and tells ^{that} the Red Army has reconquered all the territory wrested from it by the Germans during the summer of last year. He then praises men of the Merchant Marine of the convoys to Russia. He finished by saying, "We look forward to the victories that are to come, to the final victory that will be won together." 120
