SALUTE TO THE RED ARMY.

All Britain commomorates Red Army Day. Starting in Bristel, we follow the lines of marching men and wemen doing honour to their Allies in arms of the Seviet Union.

Mr.A.V. Alexander, the Furst Lordnef the Admiralty, is in the Mercantile City as representative of the British Government. Through the war-scarred heart of Eristol winds the Parade of service men and wemen, as a salute to the fighting process of the superb Russian Army.

In like manner Cardiff gives expression to her admiration. In this great Welsh City, we see Mr. Attlee, as Ministerial representatives, matching with obvious pleasure this impressive salute to the heroic Red Army, colebrating its 25th birthday with brilliant victories in the field. The day is also marked by a statement from Premier Stalin on the nine-million Germans put out of action in eighteen months of war.

As in Cardiff, so in Manchester. The world's centre of manufacture joins fully in the day of celebration. On the restrum stands Major Leberdov, a Red Army Officer and an honoured guest. The British people are whelehearted in their tributes manifest in a day of military parades.

Now we travel to the city of steel where a similar scene is being enasted. The Minister present at Sheffield for the eccasion is Sir Stafford Gripps. In the midst of this display we give thought to the rapidly approaching day when, to our material help to Eussia, will be added the Ar,y of European invasion. These ranks of marching men twll of bthe accumulating force which has grown from a Britain, resolute in adversity and alone, now awaiting the signal which will answer Russia's call for physical belp.

The peak of pageantry is at London's Albert Hall, where drama, verse and music combine in an impressive demonstration; the British Government's tribute to the U.S.S.R. Pive thousand people and more witness a magnificent spectacle, during which the stage is dressed with the uniforms of men and women, marshalled in such a way as tomake each and all of them significant parts in a grand design.

Here now are some highlights from a speech given by Mr. Eden.

"In three months the Russian Army has reconquered all the territory wrested from it by the Germans during the summer of last year, and more besides. Much more besides, for the Red Army has driven into the minds of the German people the lesson that German troops can be defeated and hurled into the confusion of retreat. We are proud that our own Righth Army has taught Rommell that lesson too.

"And here let me add one other tribute which is of a demestic character - to the men of the Royal Navy and the Merchant Marine, who, in all seasons and in all weathers, have braved the perils of that Northern route to carry munitions and supplies of all kinds to our Russian Allies."
