SUBMARINE SIDON DISASTER.

The Sidon's captain was Lt-Commander Verry, who has also seen service in midget submarines. He was among the officers and ratings who were picked up from the sea by the rescue-ships. It is thought that most of those who were umaking unable to escape had been killed by the explosion. Beside the mother-ship, a circle of air-bubbles indicated where the submarine lay --- some forty feet below --- as divers and frogmen continued their work

All these men who took part in the rescue operations, were risking their lives in the cause of duty. Outstanding gallantry was shown by Surgeon-Lt.
