REFUGEES.

From Klingenburg, thirteen fugitives, including children and a baby, formed the latest group to escape to Austria from Hungary. The baby had been given a sleeping pill, to ensure that the crossing of the border would be made in silence. The party included a bride and bridegroom, who had been born in Austria. All the grown-ups were accommodated at a refugee center.

RELEASED PRISONERS.

Arriving at a Border Patrol Barracks at Hanover in Germany, the prisoners repatriated from Russia were fitted out with new clothes for their re-entry into civilian life and freedom. This party totalled some four hundred and fifty men. Most of them had been held in Russia on charges of espionage.
